Redmond Centre Usage	Bookings at the RCC have continued to rise following successful summer program and events. The Centre is fully booked the majority of the time.

Facilities Issues	There are no FM issues in the Centre to report.			
October Activities	During August we delivered 9 days of training to 8 local young people as part of the My Place project. The training focused on social research skills and was delivered by Social Life, Kings College London and MHDT project officers.  We delivered a 10 <sup>th</sup> anniversary edition of Hidden River festival in September. The program included 12 performers, 15 stall holders and 6 food vendors as well as a Zen bus, bird watching, nature walks and activities for children. The event was well attended by around 1000 people and the response from attendees was very positive, with many commenting it was the best Hidden River yet. The Zen Bus reported being the busiest they've ever been at a festival, and the Coal House Café and London Wildlife Trust noted high attendance and uptake for workshops as well.  We began a new project called A Taste of Home which provides free use of the RCC kitchen for refugees and asylum seekers living in local temporary accommodation to batch cook nutritional, culturally familiar meals for themselves and their families. Many of these people don't have access to cooking facilities and the food the hostels provide is often unfamiliar to them and low in nutritional value. The project is a 4 week pilot during October.
