2	Facilities Issues	There are no FM issues in the Centre to report.		
3	Summer Activities	During August we delivered 9 days of training to 8 local		
		young people as part of the My Place project. The training		
		focused on social research skills and was delivered by Social		
		Life, Kings College London and MHDT project officers.		
		We delivered a 10 th anniversary edition of Hidden River		
		festival in September. The program included 12 performers,		
		15 stall holders and 6 food vendors as well as a Zen bus, bird		
		watching, nature walks and activities for children. The event		
		was well attended by around 1000 people and the response		
		from attendees was very positive, with many commenting it		
		was the best Hidden River yet. The Zen Bus reported being		
		the busiest they've ever been at a festival, and the Coal		
		House Café and London Wildlife Trust noted high		
		-		
		attendance and uptake for workshops as well.		
		We began a new project called A Taste of Home which		
		provides free use of the RCC kitchen for refugees and asylum		
		seekers living in local temporary accommodation to batch		
		cook nutritional, culturally familiar meals for themselves and		
		their families. Many of these people don't have access to		
		cooking facilities and the food the hostels provide is often		
		unfamiliar to them and low in nutritional value. The project is		
		a 4 week pilot during October.

Woodberry Wetlands Neighbourhood Forum	The next Neighbourhood Forum will be on Wednesday 15 th November. The theme is support for asylum seekers and refugees. Flyers and a newsletter will be sent out in early November.
My Place	The 8 young people taking part in My Place (the Community Ambassadors) conducted surveys at Hidden River Festival. They carried out 3 separate surveys; two on their chosen research topics of leisure facilities and building maintenance, and one to gather feedback on Hidden River itself. In total they gathered 36 survey responses. We have scheduled three visits during half term for the Ambassadors to visit the different stakeholders in Woodberry Down and learn more about local decision making processes; a site visit to NHG's Grahame Park scheme in Colindale, a briefing from Roda, Simon Slater and WDCO board members on the history of the regeneration and WDCO's role in it, and a visit to the marketing suite and possible phase 3 site visit with Berkeley. The Ambassadors will also be discussing how they can work with the partners around the masterplan consultations in November.
