

2	Facilities Issues	There are no FM in the Centre issues to report.
3	Summer Activities	During August we had 7 Kitchen Social sessions which were highly attended an enjoyed by the local families that attended. Kitchen Social provides free meals and activities for families during the school holidays.
4	Ongoing Activities	Regal Ballet, Capoeira, Mrs Independent Living, Toastmasters, EK Outreach Services, Ceramics, Active Within Healthy Lifestyle Sessions, Friday Prayers, Solution Care, Girls Friendly Society, x2 churches, Growing Communities vegetable collection, Community Fridge, Digital Connect (one to one digital support), and Lunch-Up Club.
	Future Events	MHDT is working to deliver the 10 th Annual Hidden River Festival which will take place in Spring Park on 13:00hrs Saturday 30 th September. Although scaled down due to funding restrictions the Festival will be a mix of activities, acts, food and stall holders. All are welcome to attend.
	Woodberry Wetlands Health Forum	The Woodberry Wetlands neighbourhood forum was a great success with 46 attendees, with a great mix of residents and health professionals from the NHS.
		The forum focused on supporting unpaid carers, in which there was talks from the Woodberry Wetlands Primary Care Network on their carers support pilot, the urgent home care visits and the Hackney Carers Centre.
	Background to Woodberry Wetlands Health Forum	Hackney CVS secondment As part of one of our staff's secondment with Hackney CVS, MHDT has been hosting 'neighbourhood health forums' which bring together healthcare practitioners, the local authority, the housing associations and

	representatives from other voluntary organisations. These have been really positively received and Miriam Burke will be chairing the meetings for the next year.
My Place	In the month of July, My Place recruited 8 young people to be the newest cohort of young people at My Place. The 8 young people were recruited to be community ambassadors. Moreover, they were recruited to better represent the thoughts of young people and the thoughts and feelings of other underrepresented voices in their community.
	In August, the 8 My Place Community Ambassadors started their work and spent the first 3 weeks of August training and learning how to properly conduct research. In this time they decided on their research topics and came up with strategies on how to properly conduct this research.
	In September, the Community Ambassadors will be conducting research at community events such as the Hidden River Festival. They will also take part in supporting discussions around the master plan and work to amplify the voices of young people and underrepresented groups in the master plan.
Food Hubs in Hackney	We received funding from City Bridge Trust to work with two other community centres in Hackney to build resilience in the voluntary food distribution network.
	Essentially, there are 3 food hubs in Hackney (of which the Redmond Community Centre is one) where surplus supermarket food is delivered by the Felix Project. Each of the food hubs then works with a network of small voluntary organisations to distribute free food to people which would otherwise have gone to landfill.
	This money is to provide training to the hubs and to the volunteer groups to: develop a strong relationship between the hubs; best support the communities we serve (signposting to other services etc); research more sustainable ways of food distribution to move away from food banks and grant funding, so Cooperatives and Community Pantries.




