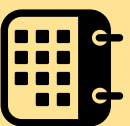

Projects

- In January we distributed just over 30,794kg of fresh food through Community Fridge, issued 25 Hackney Foodbank vouchers, and supported asylum seekers to cook 140 meals. Some of this food was also shared with the North London Muslim Community Centre who distribute the surplus food to their beneficiaries.
- We continue to support residents with ensuring they are claiming all the benefits they are entitled to, signposting and referrals to local services.
- We have submitted a joint funding bid to celebrate Ageing Without Limits Day in June in collaboration with the Zen Bus and Active Within.
- We are in conversation with RNID (Royal National Institute for Deaf People) to set-up some drop-in sessions to do hearing screenings, hearing aid checks and repairs and a peer support group.
- We are supporting a local residents to set-up a series of free mindfulness sessions.
- We are in conversation with the PEEP Learning Together programme that supports 3-4 year olds with early language development and parents with home learning materials.
- We have a new volunteer at the centre supporting us with various programmes and is part of the Hackney 100 programme. The Hackney 100 programme aims to support Hackney residents into meaningful employment with part-time voluntary and part-time paid work in an industry of their choosing.

Neighbourhoods Programme:

- The Woodberry Wetlands action group is working towards their next forum on Tuesday 3rd February, 12-2pm at Hackney Showroom. The focus will be on social isolation and navigating services for residents 55+, with the aim of linking up the south of the neighbourhood.
- Woodberry Wetlands neighbourhood has been chosen to test out ideas on improving messaging on sexual health services and linking up with community pharmacies. The project will target young people (16-early 20s) who live in the Woodberry Down and Brownwood wards. Sexual health is a priority for the Woodberry Wetlands action group and we will share learnings with other neighbourhoods. We will be working closely with Public Health, Volunteer Centre Hackney and Woodberry Wetlands PCN.

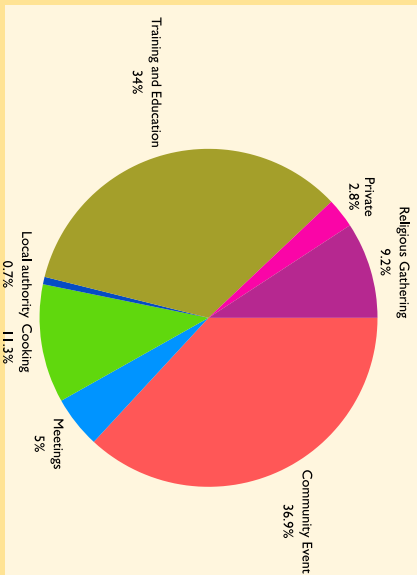
SUMMARY

- These charts provide data on use of the RCC for the month of January 2026. We host different activities, some of which are open to the public, including church services, prayer meetings, exercise groups and community events. Community event represents events that are open to the public for free or at low cost eg: church, youth group, vegetable collection, yoga etc.
- The graph at the bottom right illustrates the percentage of the booking type we have at Redmond. Our primary bookings are regular reservations, which occur weekly or monthly and are offered at a discounted rate. LDT Funded bookings will be termed as booking that are funded fully or partially by LDT and no/little hiring fee has been charged for these bookings. We have a new regular booking that aims at supporting SEND kids. They rent Room1 on every weekday of the month.
- Our office space is fully utilized, with three rooms currently booked on a monthly basis by Hackney Works, Hackney Libraries and Ek Outreach (shown as office space in the Chart). Additionally, we accommodate private and community events, which may or may not be LDT funded.

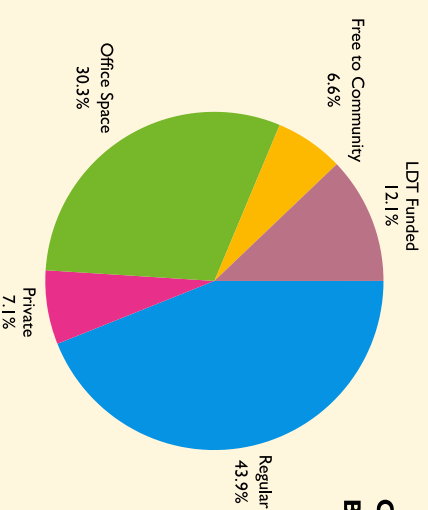


TRAFFIC (TOTAL ATTENDEES)

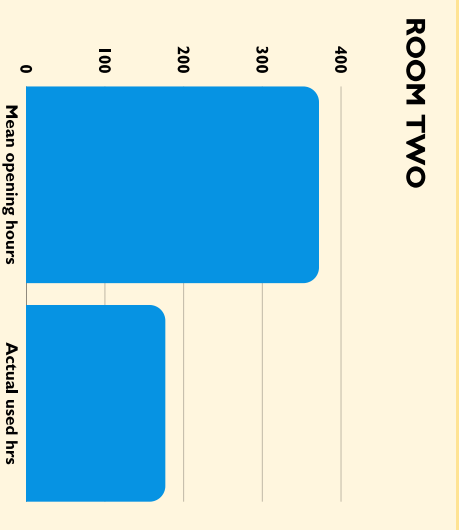

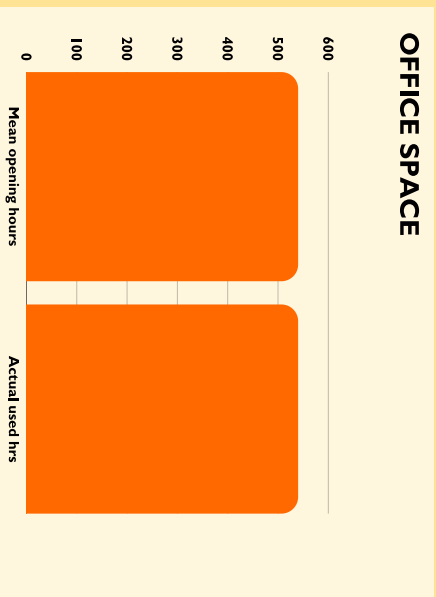

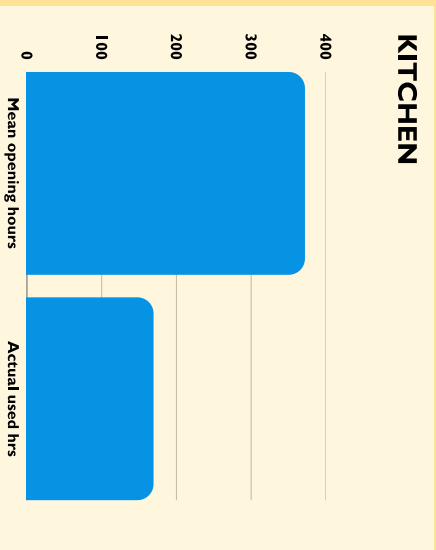

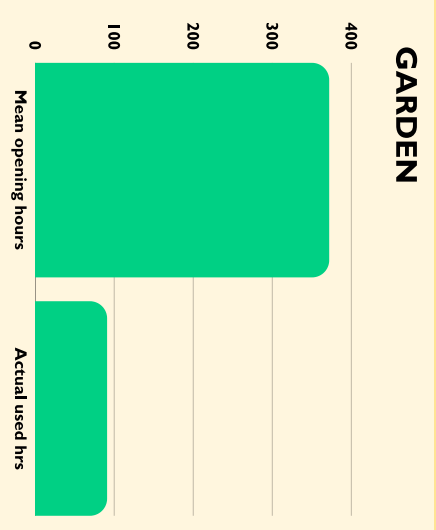

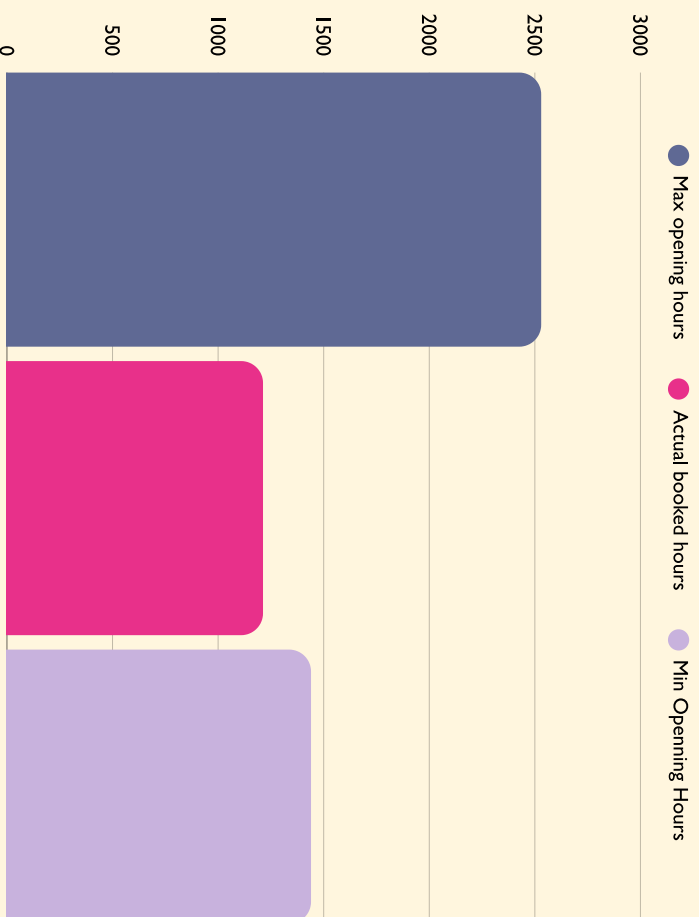
